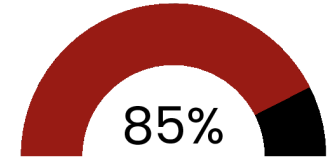

### Kaupapa Te Rapu

Whaanau raise concerns over the ever-increasing exposure and access to alcohol in already vulnerable communities.



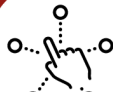
### LOCATIONS OF BOTTLE SHOPS

Specific streets and suburbs are identified as locations of concern including bottle shops with close proximity to waahi tapu (sensitive and sacred) sites, for example marae, churches, schools, kohanga reo, waananga.



### QUANTITY OF BOTTLE SHOPS

Bottle shops on every corner normalises the presence of alcohol, with more bottle shops seen in areas with greater Maaori populations.



### EASE OF ACCESS TO ALCOHOL

Bottle shops within walking distance to homes makes it too convenient to purchase alcohol.



### LOW COST OF ALCOHOL

Cheap alcohol prices make it an easy choice to drink at home. Alcohol becomes an affordable option for many.
